

SKH Li Fook Hing Secondary School

The school has received HK\$52,800 (HK\$200 x 264 students (names unknown)) from the government to implement school-based after-school learning and supporting programs in 2006-2007. The aims of the programs are:

- (a) to build up the capacity and self-esteem of the disadvantaged students conducive to improvement of life skills;
- (b) to lead to fundamental changes to the attitudes of the students and the parents;
- (c) to suit the needs of students concerned.

The school has a generous provision of HK\$52,780 amount for the programs, summing at HK\$105,580. Three programs will be run for under-privileged students:

- (1) Generic skills workshops: All 190 S1 students will receive twelve 75-minute after school lessons from a service provider who will tailor made materials for them. Activities include: time management, self-image, communication skills, etc. These skills are important for students' further development; they are also essential skills for the new senior secondary school curriculum. The first workshop will begin in October 2006. Non-disadvantaged students will NOT be funded, and will be charged for HK\$200 for all twelve workshops.
- (2) School performances: A total of 300 students (different levels) will be taken to local school events on fun fairs, plays, musicals, etc. to broaden their horizons in cultural activities. Students will have more exposures to different learning activities proper for their levels. Students may also be subsidized for movies related to their academic needs.
- (3) Teaching in China: A total of 120 students will be teaching a one-week course in small Chinese towns every year. Students will learn to interact with Chinese children in English and have geography field trip experience. The program is made possible partly from the English Enhancement Scheme funded by EMB for 2007-2012.
- (4) If there is a need, the school will provide additional funding for useful activities for students in need.

The activities are subject to annual review and will be closely monitored by teachers-in-charge.
